ACCIDENT PROVES FATAL TO SON OF VICTOR E. DUCAN HERE

Swallowing a safety pin caused the death of a young boy, Victor E. Duncan, 11 years old, of the Rosewood Park area, expected to make these streets be graveled streets in the village. A total of 40,000 square feet of eight-inch concrete pavement was constructed in 1926. This area includes Oakland avenue, Dupont avenue from Maple to Oak, and the Maple to Forest avenue, between street and the west side of Chester street. In addition, 930 square yards of concrete with asphalt surface in connection with the widening of Brown street from Pierce street to Woodward avenue, put in at a cost of \$8,500, 96, bringing the total cost of this paving to \$115,085.50.
