The minimum equipment and personnel for the proper function of the health department of Birmingham includes an officer, a laboratory, a health officer, a laboratory technician, a sanitary officer, and a public health nurse, according to the suggestions in the annual report of Dr. A. W. Newitt, health officer of Birmingham in the hands of Manager Harry Starr today.
