VILLAGE MAN'S MOTHER IS DEAD

Mrs. McBain, First M. S. C. Graduate, Succumbs in Grand Rapids

Word is received here today of the death Monday of Mrs. Eva McBain, the mother of Ralph McBain, teller at the First State Bank and president of the Young Men's Service club, Mrs. McBain, who was 70 years old, died suddenly in Grand Rapids of a stroke, she had been ailing for only two days. She is a cousin of Bolla J. Cornell, president of the school board here.

Mrs. McBain was the first woman graduate of Michigan State college, and for 20 years, she was the owner and manager of the Laidlaw Hotel and cottages on Grand Island, one of the Lake Superior group. She is the widow of William McBain, former secretary of the Grand Rapids Flower society.

Her son, Ralph, who was another son, William, of Grand Rapids, and her daughter, Mrs. Helen J. Robinson, of Grand Rapids, are the only survivors. Her husband died in 1904. Mrs. McBain had lived for many years.
