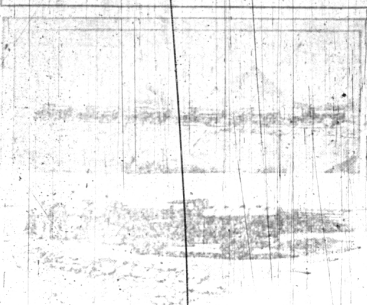

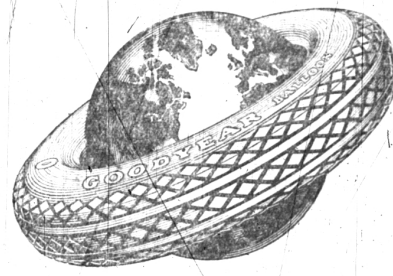
HOW TO MAKE A LONG SPOUT OIL CAN. Take an ordinary oil can, fashion a cork near the end of the spout, not for obstruct the opening, but to hold the cork directly below the spout opening. This will allow the oil to flow to the farthest tip.
