

OAKLAND COUNTY JUDGES MAY GET SALARY INCREASE

Bill Recently Introduced Provides For \$2,500 Raise

WOULD GET \$12,500.00

Under the bill recently introduced into the Michigan legislature, Oakland county judges would have their pay increased from \$10,000 to \$12,500 a year. The bill provides for an increase in the salaries of circuit judges from \$5,000 to \$7,500, in addition to what the county board of supervisors feels the work warrants. Heretofore Oakland county has paid an additional \$5,000 to its judges, making their annual salary \$10,000.

Michigan presided over by one or more judges elected for a term of six years. Each judge is required by law to be a duly qualified attorney admitted to practice in all courts of the state and is prohibited from practicing his profession elsewhere each year they receive receiving any fees or compensation with the practice of the law.

The Circuit Courts are courts of general jurisdiction wherein are first tried all cases above the jurisdiction of a justice of the peace. Each year they handle matters involving millions of dollars. Judges are required to be expert in every innovation in practice and procedure resulting from each session of the legislature.

There are many judges throughout the state who have devoted the best years of their lives on the bench but because of inadequate salary have been unable to accumulate sufficient means to provide for the needs of old age. These men pass on it becomes necessary to fill their places with lawyers of outstanding ability. This will be a difficult task unless the salary attached to the office will permit the incumbent to maintain himself and accumulate a reserve for declining years, members of the legal profession are not in a position to surrender their practice and devote their talents for the benefit of the state.

Not a Life Job
Judges are now selected from among the younger attorneys who have not yet accumulated a practice and are anxious to get a start or from those who have amassed sufficient wealth so they are willing to occupy the office for a term to put out a legal career. Neither of these makes the best judge because they have only temporary purposes in view.

Many Pay More
Statistics reveal that Michigan pays her Circuit Judges lower salaries than New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Ohio, Massachusetts, California, New Jersey, Indiana, Wisconsin, West Virginia, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Delaware and Wyoming. The percentage of state courts is the lowest in Michigan with the exception of Delaware and New Jersey. Bills are pending in 22 states for an increase in salaries of Circuit Judges. A new bill passed recently by Congress increases salaries of federal district judges to \$10,000 per year and the office is an appetitive one.
