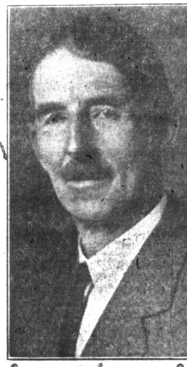

The Village President Should Be An Active Official

The members of the Village Commission are men whose entire time is taken by their business or work, and no unnecessary burdens should be placed upon them so that they may give their full time and efforts to problems and matters which rightfully demand their entire attention.

The position of Village President is not one that can be run vicariously or by any one who is not at all times available for important questions that arise in a community of the size and type of Birmingham. It would not be my policy to shift burdens and responsibilities to other members of the commission whose full time is occupied with their regular business. I believe it would be my duty as Village President to familiarize myself with Village affairs and to devote a considerable part of each day in co-operation with the Village Manager in carrying out the policies of the Village Commission.

Against the Theater Ordinance, Proposition No. 3

Here is what he says:

"The motion picture theater is one of the greatest educational mediums in community life. It is important, therefore, that a community of the high class of Birmingham should have a motion picture theater in keeping with its standards, both as to structure and management. It is necessary that we have a motion picture theater owned and managed by an organization that has already demonstrated its high character and responsiveness to the demands of the communities which its theaters serve. The organization represented by Mr. Kunkly owns and operates the most beautiful and highest class theaters of this kind in the world. In order for a theater of this character to be constructed and operated profitably in Birmingham it is necessary that it be permitted to be open seven days because the revenue from six days in the week, all of which are working days, will not be sufficient to pay the costs of maintaining such a theater and give the people of Birmingham the higher class motion picture plays which the village will demand."



"The fact is that the people are not one of Sunday operation of it theater, but the proper censorship of the pictures which are presented on that day as well as on the other six days of the week. It is far better for us to keep our young people of Birmingham for this kind of entertainment than to force them to go to other places."

"Let's have our own motion picture theater. Let's have one operated by good management that will be responsive to our wishes and subject to our regulations."

There must be a New Village Manager:
