Hunt Issues Monthly Review Of Work Done In Township Court

A total of \$552 in fines was collected in Judge Malcolm Hunt's justice court last month, from state offenses and from village offenses in Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills...

"Christianity As Equivalent For War," Is Armistice Day Sermon Topic

Christianity as a moral equivalent of war was offered by the Rev. D. L. Woodward, pastor of the First Baptist Church, in his Armistice Day sermon Sunday morning.

Mentioning the recent declaration of a Harvard professor that a moral equivalent of war must be found in order to abolish war, Mr. Woodward admitted that war tends to revive the spirit of self-sacrifice, and to challenge the dormant qualities of manhood such as courage, unselfishness and a fearless devotion to a higher ideal.

"The fighting instinct is used in the Christian warfare against sin and unrighteousness in all its forms. Paul the first great interpreter of Christianity, conceived of the Christian life as a battle. He did not say to Timothy: 'Endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.' Surely if Christianity is true to the spirit of its founder, it is militant and aggressive. Christ calls for men with courage, conviction and enthusiasm. We need soldiers of the cross to fight in the army of the Lord against the organized vice and corruption of our social and political life."
