TRUCK PLANT READY JAN. 1

Expect To Have Township Factory Ready Soon For Operation

Officials of the Yellow Truck & Coach Manufacturing company believe today that the new plant in Bloomfield Township will be in operation by Jan. 1. The works are costing \$5,500,000 and are located on South boulevard, Pontiac.

The last of the steel for the big main building, 2,100 feet in length and the longest single story factory building in the world, was swung into place on Friday, James Savage, assistant chief engineer, said.

The entire building will be under cover in about 10 days, Mr. Savage also stated.

ON "CODDLING" THE PUBLIC
A famous newspaper editor remarked to me recently: "I have been writing for papers now for more than 30 years. I have conducted crusades of all kinds in the interest of public welfare and have fought, bled, almost died for what I took to be the cause of the so-called common people. Not once have I written anything that I don't believe. Yet I feel sure today that I have done far more harm than good."

Of course I asked him to explain why. "Because," he said, "it always does harm to coddle people, whether one or two children or the entire public. If I guard the public against being robbed by dishonest politicians, it doesn't help them to protect themselves. They simply get in the habit of depending on me or other editors to point out dangers next time. If the public were let alone and robbed long enough, people would eventually get so sick of it that they would rise in their might and assert themselves."

"It's the same way with children," my editor friend went on. "If you keep them away from all temptation and give them no chance to do wrong, they never develop strength of character. I'll venture to say that if you took 100 boys and let them do as they pleased, and another 100 placed under the strictest discipline, the group you let alone would come out with a sum total of character stronger than the average of the others. Of course there would doubtless be more who would fall by the wayside and go completely wrong in the let-alone group. But the ones who survived would have met so many temptations and resisted them that they would be stronger than the average of those who had never had occasion to develop such resistance."

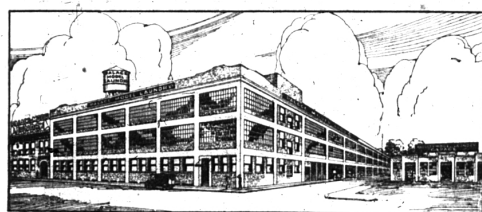
