PLAN RITES FOR VICTIM

Warren Man, Killed In Detroit, To Be Buried Saturday

Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. tomorrow for John C. Setters, 27 years of age, Warren, who died Tuesday night of a fractured skull, received in an automobile accident at Fourteenth and La-Belle streets, Detroit at 5:40 p. m. Tuesday. The services will be held from the home. Burial will be at Oak View cemetery, Royal Oak. Mr. Setters leaves his wife, Mrs. Emma Setters, to whom he had been married for five months, and a brother in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Andrew Carlson, 6740 Clifton street, Detroit, driver of the car which struck Mr. Setters' car, throwing him to the pavement, where he struck on his head, is in jail today in Detroit, on a charge of negligent homicide, pending an investigation into the accident. Carlson was driving west on La-Belle avenue and Setters was driving north on Fourteenth street, when the accident occurred, Carlson failing to stop for Bourtooth, which is a cross street, according to the police. Setters was removed to Highland Park General Hospital, where he died.
