PRAISE GIVEN RURAL SCHOOL

Visiting Teachers Pay Compliment To Lederle's Work

The rural educational system in this county functions admirably and has some desirable features which are lacking in the rural school system of our state," the helping teachers told E. J. Lederle, county school commissioner, when they had inspected as many of the county's schools as it is possible in one day's tour.

"We can actually see the definiteness of the program in the county as it operates in the schools. There is a social atmosphere, lacking in many rural systems, which gives a real training for citizenship.

"This social atmosphere serves to remove the self-consciousness in children which hinders their full development and makes them realize that they are living now rather than preparing for life or learning to be adults. The cleanliness and tidiness of the buildings, even in the old schools, is another commendable feature. The Saturday zone meetings with small groups are very effective, too."

by the Michigan Tuberculosis Association and its affiliated county and local branches. The pennies received from the sale of these cheery Christmas seals with the double-barred cross finance the fight against tuberculosis.

This fight has to date been successful as evidenced by the fact that the State Department of Health recently compiled figures which show that 1,000 less persons died of tuberculosis in Michigan in 1926 than would have died had the 1907 death rate prevailed. However, the fight against tuberculosis must go on, as this disease still takes more lives between the productive years of 18 and 45 than any other known disease.

Gov. Fred W. Green, honorary chairman of the Christmas seal sale, in Michigan has issued the following Thanksgiving Day proclamation because he believes that the "life-saving qualities of the tuberculosis Christmas seals should recommend them to the attention of each and every one."

"To the People of Michigan: "From Thanksgiving Day to Christmas for the twentieth year, you will be asked voluntarily to buy tuberculosis Christmas Seals.

"With the funds realized from the sale of these seals is carried on the work of the Michigan Tuberculosis Association and its affiliated branches.

"In view of the fact that there are probably 40,000 living cases of active tuberculosis in Michigan the people of this State have an intense interest in the furtherance of the work of this organization. To prevent needless death is a noble act. Such is the purpose of the tuberculosis Christmas Seal for which I earnestly bespeak your generous support."

LENINGRAD, Russia.—Sitting on the pavement outside an old folks' home was a very pretty, delicate, white-haired woman of 50. She heard us talking English and asked us what we wanted. Her English was clear and beautiful.

"What are you doing here?" we asked.

"Nothing. That is my tragedy," she answered. "My husband was a high official under the czar. He was killed in the revolution. My son and daughter died. I do not know whether they are alive, and am entirely alone, friendless, without a relative. I speak English, French and German, and I had an excellent European education."

"I can do nothing here. They feed me; they give me a place to sleep, but I have no one to talk to here. Sometimes in the winter they bring me pupils to coach in foreign languages, but usually I have nothing to do but sit and think. Let me talk to you a few moments about the outside world where I can never go again."
