TUESDAY NIGHT will be Civic Night. Governor Fred Green will be the principal speaker along with a group of county and local officials. The meeting will be held at the Baldwin High School auditorium.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT will mark the opening of the theater. The proceeds from this show will be turned over to the Community House under whose directions the tickets are to be sold.

THURSDAY NIGHT Clarence Vliet and Melvin Hart will offer a show at the High School. Classes will be in session, chapel exercises, etc., will be offered to illustrate the activities of the school. A talk relating to the Pied Piper has been arranged through the courtesy of Phil Williams for the afternoon. Games and a Tug-of-War will also be featured in the afternoon.

FRIDAY NIGHT will be Merchant Night. This evening will be devoted to a concerted business activity in which the public will be specifically directed to local stores. Special features will be presented by the various business organizations.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON will be devoted to an aerial circus in which Schlee and Brock will take an active part. Special stunts and daring feats will entertain the crowds.

SATURDAY EVENING has been left open.

SUNDAY will be Church Day. Union services in the theater will permit an assembly to gather in a religious program. A general inspection of churches will be effected throughout the day.

During the week a window shopping contest will be conducted. Each day letters which make up the spelling of "Kunsky Birmingham Theater" will be placed in various stores. The purpose of this will be, of course, to increase an interest in the windows of these establishments. Prizes will be tickets to the theater.

Two exhibitions will be maintained as an interest compelling feature. The "Model City" will be on display next to the Birmingham Savings Bank. The "Swiss Village" will be somewhere along E. Maple avenue. These exhibitions are particularly novel and interesting. 22,000 moving mechanical parts constitute the construction. Tickets to these exhibitions will be given to the merchants and will be distributed by them at their own discretion.

A parade is scheduled for Friday night. Boy Scouts and many local organizations will make up this parade. Floats and a band are also to be included.
