GUNMEN ROB 2 MOTORISTS

Take Clothing, Jewelry And Money, Escape From Pursuers

Two motorists are aiding police today in the seeking bandits who robbed them near Birmingham late at night last week. Charles McCreedy, chauffeur, 937 Seven Mile road reported to the sheriff's office that a bandit boarded his automobile at the Twelve Mile and John R. roads Saturday night and forced him at the point of a gun to drive to the Southfield road. There the lone bandit was joined by two others who followed in a machine and robbed of \$14 in cash, jewelry and an overcoat. Three men believed to be the same bandits but driving a different car robbed William Bredinger at his roadside stand on the Rochester road south of Big Beaver three hours later of \$55 from his pockets and \$30 from the cash register. They then speeded to the Thirteen Mile road where they turned west. They were pursued by many who witnessed the robbery but they outdistanced their followers.

BIRMINGHAM IS NOW PAINTED, AH, YELLOW

Birmingham is painted today not red but yellow. It is the result of the tri-monthly renewal of traffic lines on the downtown streets. Yellow is considered the most effective color for the lines because the paint used is said to last longer under traffic and to show more clearly. Parking and safety zones on the downtown streets are clearly marked, after the "painter's spree" with their last coat until spring. "We were looking for mushrooms," explained Frank Bradley and Jack White, of Detroit, when Deputy Bert Foreman found them trespassing in his orchard in Southfield. "Then, what are you doing with this tub full of apples?" Deputy Foreman asked, pointing to a wash tub which the men had filled with fruit. "Well, you see," one of them started to explain, "we couldn't find any mushrooms, so we decided to go to the judge," said Deputy Foreman, of words to that effect. So Frank and John appeared in Judge Malcolm Hunt's office, and pleaded guilty to "swiping" apples from Deputy Foreman's orchard. They were fined \$10 each, which they paid. All this happened last Thursday.
