CHURCH DRIVE TO BE HELD

Episcopal Diocese To Institute Endowment Fund

Oakland County is part of the territory to be covered in the campaign next month for a \$1,000,000 centennial endowment fund for the Episcopal diocese of Michigan, according to an announcement today. The income from the proposed fund, money for which will be raised throughout eastern Michigan, will be used for Diocesan welfare, church promotion and expansion work. "I am greatly pleased to see this official statement, in a diocese whose progress has made it one of the most notable in the United States in growth and results obtained. The campaign will be conducted simultaneously with the annual Every Member campaign in the various parishes November 11 to 21."

The proposal to secure the required endowment fund, strongly advocated by Bishop Herman Page of Detroit, has the official endorsement of the diocesan executive council. Enthusiastic cooperation of the 108 parishes in the Eastern half of the state, comprising the Michigan already has been indicated as a result of 13 regional conferences conducted by Bishop Page recently, when the active participation of nearly 100 clergymen and vestrymen who attended the meetings, was secured. The regional conferences were held at Royal Oak, Alpena, Bay City, Saginaw, Flint, Jackson, Monroe, Ann Arbor, Port Huron, and other points in the city of Detroit.

The State Commission to supervise the work for crippled children in the state, provides for a census of all crippled children, and enables the Commission to establish classes for crippled children in the hospitals under the direction of the State Department of Public Instruction. This legislation places Michigan among the progressive states of the Union which have taken action with regard to the care of their crippled children. "After the completion of the census next year, which will furnish the first complete and authentic list of crippled children in the state, there must be held at least one clinic for each county every year. Since this provision does not become effective for a year, the children must continue this particular work in behalf of the crippled children. It is therefore, just as imperative as ever that each county organization lend its

the body are literally starved, light enough to circulate and when oxygen is diminished, a fire which purifies it. It is just as important to the body as the blood itself is just as much dependent upon this principle component of air. Remember, always, whether you are walking or standing, or sitting or lying down, to breathe deeply from your diaphragm. You can intensify the benefits you get from your exercises by combining correct breathing with them. When you simply raise and lower your chest, you do nothing, but try to inhale with the first step and exhale with the second, and you will immediately feel that you are getting a respite. Here is a device that is excellent for constipation. Drink one or two glasses of water and lie down on your back, with your knees raised, breathing deeply, they grow insurprisingly large expansion. If you breathe deeply, not only from the chest, but from the diaphragm, you will find that it is not difficult to do and is extremely effective. I have told you about the importance of the finger tips of the blood stream and of ribs, then take a deep breath and let your hands with the finger tips fall under your hands, your making them contribute to your breaths that way you get plenty of deal with "Keeping Your Shoulder you change the supply in the whole expanse of your lungs, get rid of that which is stagnant and unhealthy. 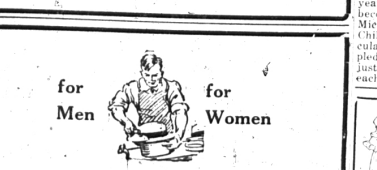
