

# SCOUT LEADER GIVES ADDRESS

L. L. Stanley Outlines Aims To Village Exchange Club

Lloyd L. Stanley, scout executive of Birmingham, told members of the Birmingham Exchange club at the luncheon Tuesday at Nortonwood Inn of the development aims of the Boy Scouts of America laying particular emphasis on the Birmingham troops.

Members of the troupe here want three things, he declared: a site for a scout camp, a room in the Community House where meetings may be held and equipment stored, and a swimming pool.

Without these, Mr. Stanley said, the troops are working under a handicap. He declared an effort would be made to have the acquisition of these essentials brought about as early a date as possible.

Tracing the history of the scout movement from its inception by Sir Baden Powell during the Boer war up to the present day, Mr. Stanley declared it was one of constant progress and promise. He said that soon after the Act of Congress here in 1916 the spirit of the movement over this country was remarkable.

# UNITED CHURCH CHANGES TEXTS

Presbyterians To Use New Praise Books In Services Sunday

On Sunday, Oct. 2, the Birmingham United Presbyterian Church, Woodward avenue at Forest, will begin the use of new praise books. This church has always used Psalms exclusively in their services of worship. However, in recent years, the congregation has been growing that in addition to singing Psalms, some provision should be made for praise which would testify to present-day Christian experience. In accordance with authority granted by the highest court of the denomination, and the Session of the local church, a new praise book has been secured. This book, known as the Bible Songs Hymnal, contains a version of each of the Psalms, together with a number of hymns chosen because of their doctrinal and literary quality.

In the back of the book there are also Scriptural responsive readings. This marks a new departure in the worship of this congregation, and may seem like a radical change in the historic policy of the United Presbyterian Church, one is invited,
