William M. Story, Bloomfield Hills Village Clerk: "While last Saturday was designated as registration day for voters in Bloomfield Hills Village for the elections Oct. 3, I shall be in my office and will not make registrations until the date of the elections."

J. W. Tatham, manager Michigan Bell Telephone company of Birmingham: "The new police phones are available to the public in cases of emergency. They connect directly with the special switch board at the police station and may be used to call police and fire departments, the ambulance or other facilities in cases of emergency. This arrangement is felt to be an improvement over phones that would be available only to members of the police force. With this system, the added security of being able to get in touch with the police is available to all residents of the village and hence comes a more thorough sense of security."

John B. Taylor, Taylor Construction company: "Birmingham is a fortunate city that Mrs. Hazel C. L. Lawler has held office so long and is so familiar with the work. This is a necessity when a community is growing at the rate Birmingham is."

Sheriff Frank Schrams: "The state law which compels all detective agencies to be licensed will be enforced in Oakland County."
