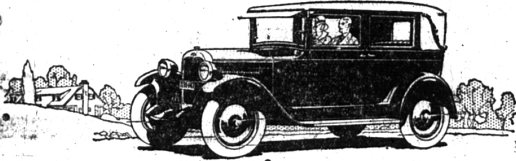

FISHERMEN RAISE STATE FINE TOTAL

Twenty-six Sportsmen Penalized in Month For Taking Undersized Fish From Lakes

Twenty-six charges of taking undersized fish from county lakes feature the county report for August of Judge Floyd S. Buck's justice court, made public today. The total number of offenses was 63, bringing in \$1,011.50 in fines. Fines for taking undersized fish ranged from \$7.50 to \$20.

Four 60-day jail sentences were meted out last month, three to drunken drivers and one to a disorderly person. One of the drunk drivers also had his license revoked for six months. The fourth drunken driver spent one day in jail and paid \$75 fine and costs. Arthur A. Cunningham, Detroit, who was sentenced to 60 days in jail and a \$50 fine in July, appealed to Circuit court against the jail sentence. The case was returned from Circuit court, and he paid a \$100 fine instead. Four more disorderly charges brought smaller fines.

Two cases were bound over to Circuit Court, one of wife desertion and one of transporting liquor. Three charges of assault and battery and three of selling adulterated milk were on the docket last month.

Other fines were: two for running a traffic signal, one for having no trailer license, three for speeding, one for reckless driving, one for leaving the scene of an accident, one for parking on the pavement, one for stealing fruit and two imposed on bus drivers for speeding.

TICKETS AVAILABLE FOR U. OF M. GAMES

Ann Arbor, Sept. 7.—While the Ohio-Michigan game, which marks the formal opening of Michigan's new football stadium, has been oversold by many thousands, tickets are still available for both the Minnesota and Navy games, to be held on November 19 and 12 respectively. Fighting H. Vost announced today. Shortly after the opening of the University on September 12, it is expected that the entire student quotas will be exhausted and the few remaining tickets available to the public, speedily taken.

The general public does not yet understand its rights insofar as tickets are concerned. Fighting H. Vost, athletic director, stated, "In our plan of ticket distribution, we specifically state that any citizen of the state has equal rights with students and graduates. Any citizen may write to the Board in Control of Athletics at Ann Arbor and receive application blanks and full particulars as to the method of ordering. Those desiring to see the Navy and Minnesota games should lose no time in filing ticket applications."
