FORECASTER OF "COLD" SUMMER HITS WEATHER BUREAU STAND

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8.—Herbert Janvin Brown, reputed prophet of a summerless 1927, is pretty rough with the government, weather bureau, and especially with P. Prof. Charles F. Marvin, his chief.

Writing to Secretary of Agriculture Jardine—the bureau's under his department's wing—Brown says "I have used 'every foul means at my command' to discredit 'the development of scientific long range weather forecasting.'"

To put it briefly, Brown accuses the professor of moon-pooling the latest improved methods of weather prophecy because his bureau didn't discover them first.

According to Brown: The sun alternately warms up and, relatively, cools off. The cycle's 11 years.

Mundane temperatures follow the sun's. Every 11th year we're due for extra cold weather. Our cycle, however, is three years behind the sun's. Why? Because it's the sea, rather than the solid earth, which retains the sun's heat when there's plenty of it and turns chill when it wanes.

offices to changing ocean temperatures; Prof. H. H. Clayton, recognized as perhaps the world's foremost meteorologist, to the practicability of long-range forecasts—all doubted by the weather bureau.

Brown's conclusions are more of his own, but the authorities he accuses them on are the best to be had.

By the way, he didn't predict a summerless year—only that it would be cold; not necessarily, summerless—and a "freak year, too."

"And so it has been cold," adds Brown. "Not abnormally," insists the weather bureau, quoting statistics. "Aw, your figures are doctored," sneers Brown. Yes, he makes specifically that charge, in his letter to Secretary Jardine.

As for freshness, demands the long distance forecaster, "How about the Mississippi floods?"
