Expect To Install Traffic  
Signals On Woodward  
This Week

Work on the installation of three new traffic lights on Woodward avenue in Birmingham is expected to start this week following the arrival of the lights at police headquarters, according to Chief James Anderson. Completion of the installation will take only a short time, he declares.

The lights cost \$12,000 and will be placed at the following street intersections: Woodward and Oakland, Woodward and Lincoln and Woodward and Brown.

## APPROVAL GIVEN POLICE PHONES

Officers Declare New System Is  
Satisfactory; Available to  
Public

Complete satisfaction with the new police call-boxes in Birmingham is expressed today by Chief James Anderson. The boxes have been in operation long enough to consider their trial a fair one, the chief said, and there is no fault to find with them.

Established at five places in the village, they are available to citizens who want to summon police in cases of emergency, as well as to police officers themselves.

In several cases of emergency we have been enabled to get in immediate touch with officers on their beats," the chief said. "We expect to have a great deal of benefit from them."

They were installed at a cost of \$1,000 and are at the following intersections: Oakland and Worth, Greywood and Harman, Maple and Lake Park, Brown and Southfield and Woodward and Lincoln.
