

CARSON GETS CHIEF'S POST

Former Birmingham Man Appointed To Lake Orion Position

Deputy Clarence E. Carson, formerly of Birmingham and for eight years a turkey in the Oakland County Jail at Pontiac, will assume his new duties as chief of police at the newly incorporated village of Oxford April 25, it is announced this week following his appointment.

Since soon after his graduation from the Baldwin High School here Carson has been a member of the sheriff's force and while his duties have in the main been inside he has many times distinguished himself. The most recent time he came into prominence he went to clear an armed would-be murderer in a swamp two miles north of Pontiac. The man had shot a woman five times and escaped into the swamp. He was surrounded by sheriff's men and an armed posse of farmers. All were being kept off by a constant pistol fire from the wanted man. Carson approached through the

underbrush to within a few feet of the hidden man and when the latter turned to aim his pistol, shot him fatally with a double barreled shot gun. While Carson was a student in Birmingham he was well known as an athlete. He also was prominent in Y. M. C. A. work here. No successor to the deputy has been named.

EASTER FINERY KEPT INDOORS

Rain, Snow Sends Churches Hurrying Home For Rest Of Day

Birmingham kept its Easter finery indoors its homes last Sunday when the mercury dropped many degrees below the usual standard for that Sunday. It was quiet in Birmingham and the churches were filled at the services during the day.

Saturday the temperature took a sudden drop and rain and snow fell. The thermometer registered a cold 27 degrees above zero Sunday while the highest temperature Saturday was 45 and the lowest 27. The cold spell lifted Tuesday afternoon.

After church services the worshippers scurried home and remained indoors the rest of the day. Birmingham's streets were deserted in the afternoon and evening, the people of the village remaining snuggled to the fireplace.

One year ago Monday the highest temperature was 51 and the lowest 26 with a mean of 41. The weather on that day was clear. In 1922 the mercury reached 72 degrees to establish a high record for 53 years and in 1914 dropped to 19 degrees for a low mark during the same period.
