

COUNTY ROAD WORK STARTS

Plan To Pave Many Highways in Oakland This Summer

Work is already under way on the paving of several roads in Oakland County and plans are be-

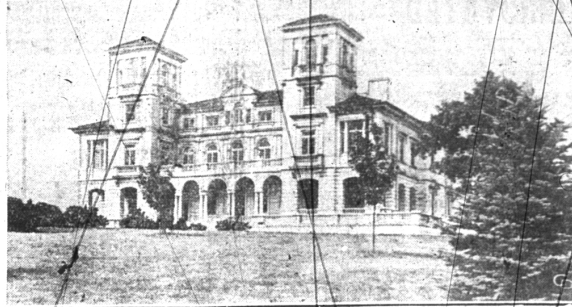
ing completed by members of the county road commission for the paving of other roads this summer. C. A. Handyside of Detroit, who was awarded the contract last fall for paving Telegraph road from the Dixie highway to a point south of the city limits, is building a side road a short distance west of West boulevard, and directly behind the county road commission buildings. From this point paving of this section of Telegraph road will be directed, and material unloaded and stored here. The Handyside company also

has the contract for some paving on the northern end of John R. road which was awarded last fall and which will be completed as soon as possible this spring. The strip is 7 1/2 miles in length. **Telegraph Road** While the paving of Telegraph road will go forward between the Dixie and Square Lake roads as soon as possible, the state highway department plans to award in May 3 the contract for the grading and draining of the Telegraph road route for eight miles south of Square Lake road, to the present pavement.

The R. D. Baker company has been awarded the contract for work on paving the Lahser road, a little more than 9 1/2 miles. Because of difference in the width of pavement and type of work required the contract was let in two sections. For the south part the figure was \$172,916.79 and for the north section \$343,258.03. A mile of the Maple road between the present pavement and the Oakland-Macomb county line will be paved this summer, the contract having been let to James McKay & Sons of Mt. Clemens for \$36,943.52.

Fourteen-Mile Road Bartling & Dull of Pontiac has been given two contracts to date. The firm will pave the White Lake road 7 miles, and connecting the Dixie at Waterford with the Telegraph road at Pontiac's western city limits, at a cost of \$268,631. Work has already been started by Bartling & Dull on the Roche-

ter road, which connects with M-24 where the Pontiac-Lapeer road turns north toward Orion. This road is 5 1/2 miles in length and the contract price is \$218,227.50.

Contracts have been awarded for two gravel roads in the county. M. E. Hull, Dryden, will improve the Oak Hill road, at a cost of \$39,943.52 and the Bogie Lake road job has been awarded to the Ayers company of Pontiac at a figure of \$5,704.00.

Contract for the Fourteen-Mile road, east through Clawson, will be awarded at the County Road Commission office at 10 a. m. on Monday, April 30, Leon V. Belknap county engineer, announced today.
