WHITE, SPEAKER AT PRESS MEET

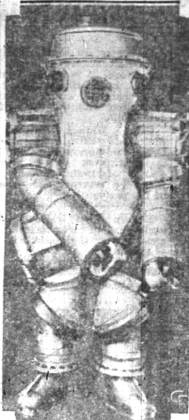

WAR ON DOGS IS CONTINUED

Police Have Orders To Effect Quarantine Until July 12

Police of Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills today are continuing their drive against dogs which are unlicensed and allowed to run at large. The warfare was started last week at the orders from the state veterinarian, B. J. Killman, who took action after several cases of rabies were reported throughout Michigan.

Orders to kill all dogs, which were off the property of the owner, without muzzle have been received. The police, however, have the alternative of giving the owner into court.

Police in Birmingham have been working this week in the clean-up and report several complaints already signed.

"We feel that the owners of dogs could cooperate to a great extent with the police in this," said Chief William Putnam of the Hills. "Naturally we dislike the work of putting to death dogs and if the people would realize the danger that comes from the dogs being allowed to run loose, no action of this kind would be necessary."

The law will be in effect until July 12.

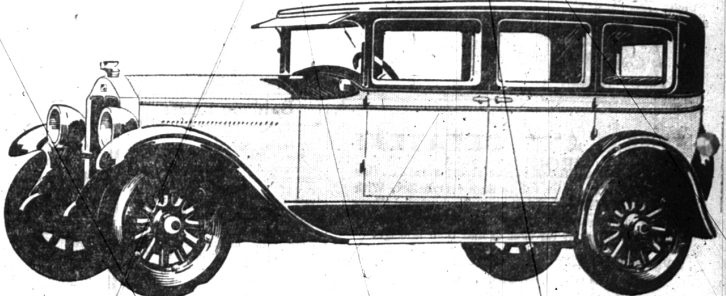
