

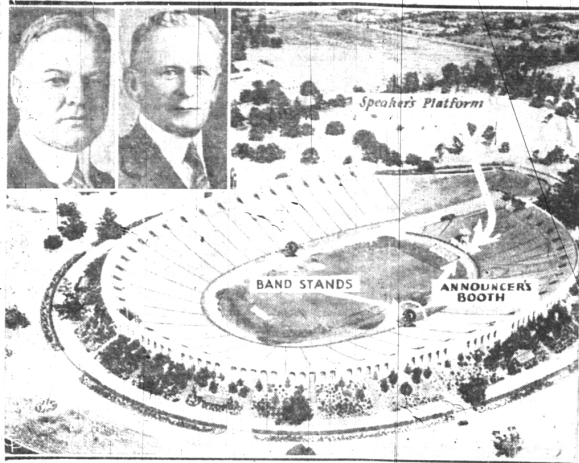

MITE OF GIRL DEFEATS CHAMPION



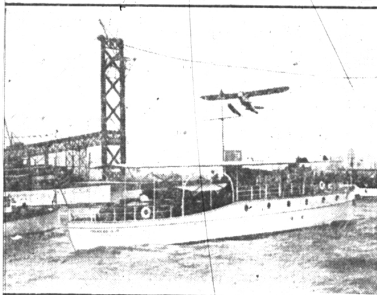

FIRST OF NEW SMALL DOLLAR BILLS



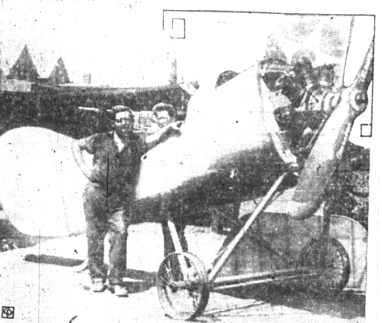

LINK U. S., CANADA WITH BRIDGE



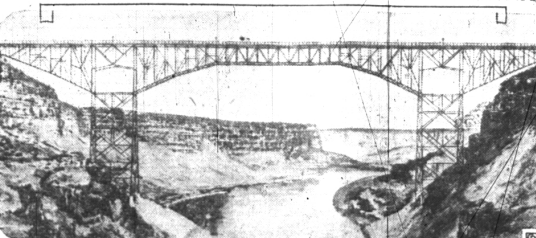

HOME-MADE PLANE SPEEDY ONE



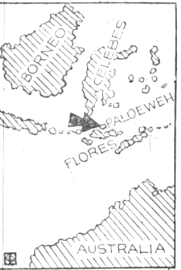

MASSIVE STEEL BRIDGE LINKS UTAH AND ARIZONA



This massive steel structure, to be completed Sept. 1, will open a new route between Arizona and Utah, across the Grand Canyon of the Colorado river, eliminating the historic Lee's ferry and also a narrow and dangerous piece of mountain road leading into Flagstaff, Ariz., little more than a desert trail used by traders and Indians.

Volcano Kills 1,000



Map shows island of Palaoeweh, in the Dutch East Indies, which virtually has been destroyed by the eruption of the Rakafinda volcano, taking the lives of 1,000 natives and wiping out six villages. Nine boats en route from Celebes island to Palaoeweh were also reported sunk. Palaoeweh is four miles in diameter and rises to a peak 4,593 feet high. It lies five miles off the north coast of Flores island, one of the larger of the Malay archipelago group.
