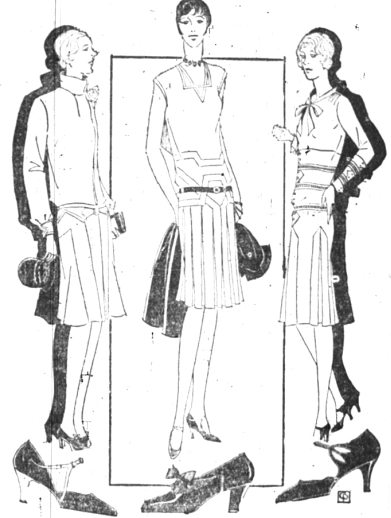
### Start at Home
