## FIRES ARE FEW, REPORT SHOWS

Department Allowed Rest During Month With 9 Calls

With no loss reported for the month of July, fires in Birmingham have reached their lowest point for the summer. The fire report made by Vernon Griffith of the fire department to the village manager for last month shows that only nine calls were made, seven in the village and two in the township. Property valued at \$1,000,000 was endangered by fire, but no loss was incurred in the village and a loss of \$2,000 in the township was covered by insurance.

The drop-off of fires from June was slight as 10 calls were made in this month, but in May the calls totaled 22, the highest number of the July report.

The actual hours of fire fighting by the fire trucks were 25, neither hose nor ladders were used but 12 gallons of chemical was employed in combatting flames. Seventy inspections were reported for the business district and 110 hydrants were checked by inspectors.

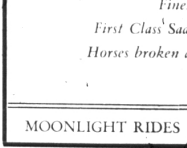
