

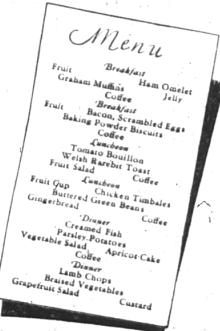

ORR ENDORSED IN THE COUNTY

Candidate Establishes Record Of Winning 31 Consecutive Cases

Endorsement of many prominent Oakland County men has already been given Norman C. Orr, first assistant prosecuting attorney, in his candidacy for nomination on the Republican ticket to the office of prosecutor in the Sept. 4 primaries.

Mr. Orr has been a member of the prosecutor's staff since 1925 and during the last two years he has tried 85 percent of all cases that have come to the office, the records show.

He has been practicing law since 1925 when he was graduated from the Detroit College of Law. He is 32 years old, married and the father of two children.

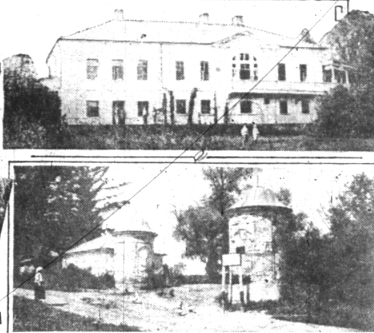
Mr. Orr has been engaged in the contracting business in the southern part of the county before entering the law profession. He has issued the following statement to the people of Oakland County:

All Russia Will Pay Tribute To Memory Of Count Tolstoy During Program Of Centenary

Exclusive Central Press Cable to Moscow, Russia. The centenary of Count Leo Tolstoy, who was born Sept. 10, 1828, will be observed in elaborate fashion by the Russian government, which has been making preparations for the event for several years under the direction of the commissar of education. The 100th anniversary of the great literary genius will be marked by exhibitions, gala performances, meetings and discussions extending for more than a week.

Among those who have been invited to attend the anniversary program are George Bernard Shaw, Roman Rolland, Sinclair Lewis, Upton Sinclair, Aldous Huxley, Rabindranath Tagore, Khat Hamsun, Mohandas Gandhi, and other writers from nearly every country in the world.

A modern high school and hospital for peasants has been built by the Tolstoy family in commemoration of Tolstoy at Yasnyaya Polyana, the village where the novelist was born and where he wrote "Anna Karenina," "War and Peace," and many of his other works.

Tolstoy's rambling country home now is a museum, simply furnished and as he left it. Alexandra, youngest daughter of the great philosopher, who lives near by, supervised the construction of the memorial buildings which will be supported by the government. Peasants of the surrounding region will gather in the large assembly hall of the new school on Sept. 12 for the presentation of some of Tolstoy's plays. Though born a nobleman, Tolstoy lived for years among the peasants.

His Diary Published. The hospital is the most modern peasant institution in Russia. Here the sick receive free care. Celebrations in schools and clubs throughout Russia are being planned by the Tolstoy jubilee committee, and a film called "Tolstoy and the Epoch of the Romanoffs," has just been released. Among other productions in a volume entitled "Tolstoy's Unpublished Literary Works" is the first installment of Tolstoy's diary. Issued by the Russian Federation of Writers and edited by Chekhov, the life-long friend

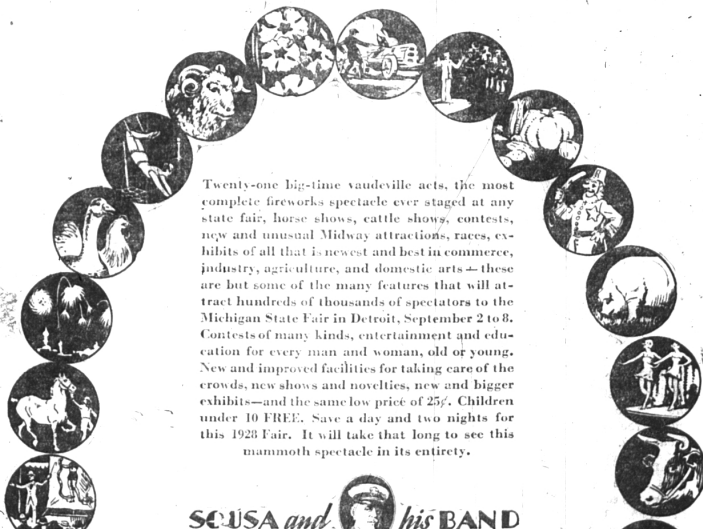
