**New Pavement Between Sixteen Mile Road And State Park Completed**

The new pavement on the John R. road between the Sixteen Mile road and Bloomer State park will be opened Sunday to light traffic and Sept. 1 to general traffic, it is announced.

The Maple road between John R. and Dequindre roads is now paved and completes a through concrete highway from Orchard Lake road to Lake St. Clair. Work on the John R. paving is being done by the Handyside Construction company of Detroit and the Maple avenue project was done by James McKay & Sons, contractors.

The shoulder work on the John R. road is complete today. The pavement is 20 feet wide.
