### HILLS OFFICER GETS PROMOTION

**Delos Anderson Made Sergeant For Activities Against Rummers**

As a reward for his work in apprehending rum runners who pass through Bloomfield Hills village, Delos Anderson, for more than a year a patrolman in the Hills, was promoted to a sergeanty last week after he returned from his vacation. The promotion came as a complete surprise to him.

Anderson has come to be well known for stopping cars laden with liquor. Records show that there

are few weeks go by without his having made at least one arrest where liquor is found in the automobile of the person stopped. Anderson was the first patrolman appointed to the force in the Hills after the incorporation of that district.

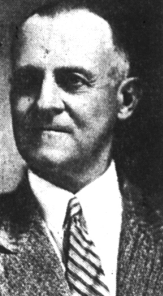
