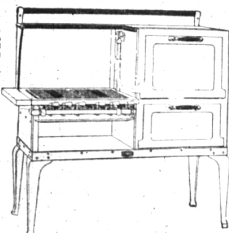

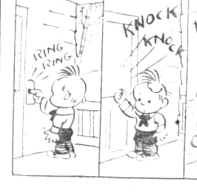
SHOT THROUGH GLASS GIVES TROY A SCARE
