CONTRACT LET FOR M-24 WORK

To Play Again

Detroit Firm To Start Work On Highway

Opening operations are underway today for the construction of the new Pontiac-Oxford road, the state route M-24, following the awarding of the contract to J. A. McKay & Sons, contracting firm of Detroit by the state highway department who notified the Oakland County road Commission.

A margin of \$14,000 under the nearest of the five competitors marked the McKay company as the lowest bidder when the bids were opened at the Plymouth office of the state highway department, Friday. Their estimate was \$288,177.51.

A 20-foot width of concrete is planned for the new highway and eliminates a number of sharp curves along the present route.

It is characteristically American to be "up-to-date," whether in dress, department or in our economic progress.

In our personal affairs we want the latest garb; we want to ride in the newest motor car; we want to read the freshest book, see the most recent play.

In our business, too, the craving is for novelty, newness, freshness. Garment-makers stimulate sales by alteration of style; automobile manufacturers, by making a few minor changes and producing a new model car.

In old-world eyes this American characteristic seems like a form of extravagance—changing merely for the sake of change and not because of substance. Yet this trait goes deeper—it is a symptom of our national pulsation—progress. It is the same spirit that causes a manufacturer to scrap a gigantic plant to build a new one for greater efficiency; a landlord to tear down a skyscraper to make room for a larger and better building of substance; a race across of structures to make way for a park.

In education, too, engineering and thought have kept pace with this progress, and yet education is neither showy nor clamorous; it inspires no personal crusaders in its behalf; it is only a modest contentment for public favor.

It is in evidence in its concern for cultural subjects, wherein Art has gained a new place in the well-organized curriculum. This subject has been made practical in that it affords an opportunity for creative expression and places the pupil in greater harmony with life's objectives and environment. The same is true of Music and similar subjects. It has emphasized the laboratory method of instruction and the important place of our sciences in the scheme of education. To this entire program has been added a wealth of material for motivating the basic "Three R's."

These conditions reflected in a happy child life, a new community atmosphere and a wholesome public interest and participation in all matters educational, represent an evolving school system that reaches for its fullest expression in the "1928 Model" school.
