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Don't overlook the importance of having your drums ground as about ninety-five per cent of the cars on the road have drums that are either out of round or have a scored surface caused by exposed rivets.

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HEART ATTACK CAUSES DEATH

Attempt Murder Theory Abandoned After Autopsy

Heart failure is named today as the cause of the death of George Phillips, 43 years old, of Wattlew road, according to Dr. Elmer A. Droschagen, Wayne county medical examiner, who made examination of the body. Phillips was found dead July 22 at the Swedish Crucible steel company where he worked as a night-switchman. Examination of the coffee carried in the lunch box of Phillips by the county chemist showed that enough potassium cyanide was present to kill the man. But following an examination by Dr. John E. Clark, Wayne county physician, it was announced that none of the coffee had been drunk. An inquest and post mortem failed to solve the mystery of the man's death until report of heart failure was announced as conclusive. A rumor of suicide was suggested at one time. Following the report of Dr. Droschagen the body was claimed by the man's wife. He is survived by seven children.
