One of Kaufmann's jobs is compiling the school census. This year, his census shows, there are 19,000 more students in the public school than a year ago.

The largest increase in noted in high schools, indicating that more students than ever before are continuing their studies beyond the intermediate grades.

But in the outlying districts, particularly the northwestern district, the school population has increased by considerably more than 16,000.

"It isn't a case," Kaufmann says, "of families with 16,000 more children of school age moving to Detroit and settling in the suburbs. That is not what accounts for the tremendous increase in school population in the outlying sections."
