SPREAD IS COMBATED

Origin of the fire that destroyed a barn filled with hay and farm implements valued at \$5,000 on the William T. Barbour estate at Long Lake road and Woodward avenue in Bloomfield Hills village remains a mystery today.

The blaze was seen Sunday evening by Luther D. Allen, president of the village, who called firemen from Birmingham and aided in saving some of the implements. Buildings on the estate were periled when a high wind fanned the flames and carried sparks. Firemen worked two hours on the blaze but it had gained too great a headway before their arrival and burned to the ground.
