ed in September 1928 at a total cost to date of \$16,250.
The teaching force due to larger enrollments and the new Quorton School increased from 95 to 107. Extra music art, home economics and physical education teachers as well as senior high school junior high school and grade teachers were included in this list. The Baldwin High School was approved by the University of Michigan for a three year period ending in 1931 and plans were made for the first mid-year graduating class of 24 members in January 1929.
School activities of all kinds prospered greatly. The Baldwinian annual for 1928 was adjudged one of the finest published by a school of this size in the United States. A Baldwin student won first prize in the national soap sculpture contest. The Baldwin hand developed to a point where it secured unstinted praise for its meritorious performances. The board of education has many unsolved problems. With 275 new houses in the Birmingham district, housing the children is a constant problem. More grade school rooms must be provided for the pupils east of Woodward avenue, the Barnum school and a senior enlarged high school building must be constructed in the near future. It is hoped a start may be made to solve these problems in the great and glorious year 1929.
The various operettas, plays and pageants produced by the pupils of the Adams, Baldwin, Barnum, Hill and Pierce buildings were finer than ever before and drew large crowds of interested parents and friends.
