

# Paving Program In Troy Announced

## YEAR'S REVIEW SHOWS LARGE AREA PAVED

Auburn avenue, if planned, but the distance through the two townships is four and a half miles.

The other Troy project is the construction of two 20 foot strips for two miles on the new 204 foot Stevens superhighway. This thoroughfare is a continuation of Oakland avenue from Detroit through Royal Oak township entering Troy at the Clawson road midway between the Rochester and John R. roads. It ends near Big Beaver.

**Drain Planned**  
A drainage project, planned to drain the east side of Clawson but affecting adjacent parts of the township was the only other public improvement measure of major proportion to be finished during 1928.

The budget for 1928 was \$60,000. This is \$10,000 higher than those of 1926 and 1927 which were both \$50,000. General township maintenance expenses are drawn from this fund. Approximately 45 per cent of the budget was used for roads, Mr. Wattle's said.

#### ADAMS ROAD ON SLATE

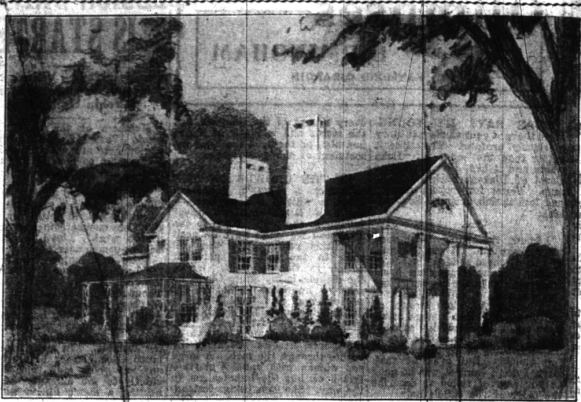
An extensive paving program is planned today for Troy township in 1929.

Eight miles of pavement, costing approximately \$320,000, was laid in Troy during 1928. It is announced by Morris Wattle, township supervisor, included in the new pavement now in use is six miles of concrete highway on the Clawson road half of which is in Royal Oak township, four miles on John R. road and one mile on Maple avenue at the east boundary of the township. The costs of this surfacing was shared by the township, the county and the assessment districts affected.

#### New Projects

The improvement of Adams road from the limits of Birmingham to Utica road is one of the paving projects to be made in Troy. Half of Adams road is in Bloomfield Township. Adams avenue will be paved through to
