RESOLUTION AND AMENDMENT OF CHARTER OF THE VILLAGE OF BLOOMFIELD HILLS

Resolved, That sections 18 and 41 of chapter 10 and sections 34 and 41 of chapter 12 of the Charter of the Village of Bloomfield Hills as adopted January 24, 1927 be amended to read...

Section 32. The expense of construction, maintenance and repair of streets, sidewalks, bridges, tunnels, viaducts, and other public works...
