After a typical offensive parade in the first quarter, similar to the numerous others Birmingham has displayed this season, the two teams settled down to exchange blows. ATTENDANCE RECORD AT ADAMS ANNOUNCED

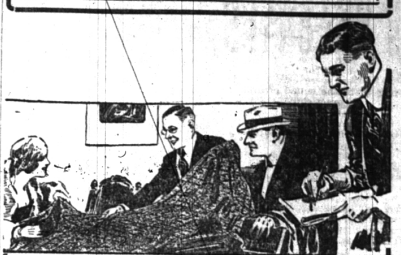
