

## ZOO CLOSES FOR WINTER

Public Pays Final Visit To Park Until Spring; Plan Improvements

The Detroit Zoo at Woodward avenue and the Ten Mile road is closed today for the winter.

The public has had its last chance to see the three lion cubs and Pauline, the huge elephant, and her daughter, now residing in their steam heated apartment net to the lion den. This apartment eventually will become the monkey house, but at present it serves admirably as living quarters for the two elephants.

Into their winter quarters go the three bear families, with all their funny tricks. Even the polar bears will get little chance in the lucky den they have come to know so well, because there are many repairs to be made during the winter. The most that keeps the bears from climbing up and shaking hands with the customers is to be widened and deepened.

The bears will remain in the cozy caves at the rear of the exhibits during the cold weather, and will be supplied with steam heat and all the other comforts of home.

deserted during the colder weather, the animals being housed in the feeding house at the top of the hill.

And so it will be all through the park, only those inhabitants who are able to withstand the wintery blasts being allowed to remain outside, and there are few of those in the park now.

Because the bear exhibit must be closed for repairs, and because the cost of keeping the park open would be out of all proportion to the interest which would be taken in it during the winter, the park commission decided to close the place until spring. They hope that this will be the last year that this step is necessary.

When the park again is ready to receive visitors, it will contain a number of new exhibits and many changes in the existing ones. The baby lions will be no longer babies; Pauline's daughter will be more sophisticated; the bears will have more tricks and there probably will be a good many more monkeys to monkey around in the new monkey house.

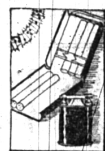
