GIRL SCOUTS GIVE DISPLAY
 First Demonstration Brings Out Features of Village Troops; Present Staged

Girl Scouts here demonstrated to the public for the first time last Friday evening their prowess and advancement in phases of the movement, in an interesting exhibition staged by Birmingham's seven troops in the Adams Junior High School auditorium.

The opening exercises consisted of "assembly," blown by Elizabeth White, bugler of Troop 2, following which the troops marched into the auditorium in mass formation. A horseshoe formation was then made, and the entire group sang.

The entire exhibition was given as if the group were one big troop, with each individual troop as a patrol. Each patrol put on a skit at its "meeting."

Troop 4 opened the program with a comedy skit, in which a bull frightens a group of girls on a hike. One, jumping a fence,

sprains her ankle. She is given first aid treatment on the spot after a Scout signals to the group. The victim is then transferred to the camp, where a hospital bed has been made up. The skit demonstrated many of the features of the second and first class tests.

A demonstration showing how the girls learn to tie knots by games was given by Troop 2.

An artificial respiration demonstration wherein girls of Troop 3 showed a rescue from the "water" and the first aid treatment following was the next on the program. "Spirit of Chivalry," a short pageant by Troop 1, was the next number. Troop 6 sang a group of songs, and Troop 7 gave an observation game demonstration in which the troop filed by a list of objects, and then were required to write the list down.
