Action Expected On Improvements Of Additional Village Thoroughfares

Estimates on improvements for several roadways in Birmingham soon will be presented to the commission for approval, it is indicated today by Manager James W. Parry, who has been seeking costs and other details in connection with the proposed improvements.

Several streets are being considered, he said Monday night at the commission meeting when the proposition to open Bates street through to Woodward avenue was discussed. No action was taken on this proposal, the commission agreeing that considerable time will have to be given to its study.
