ROCHESTER IS SWAMPED HERE

Baldwin Quintet Romps Over Visitors With 35 To 12 Score

By piling up a huge lead and adding to it throughout the contest, the Baldwin quintet swamped the Rochester quinet last Friday night on the high school floor by a score of 35-12.

Rochester was unable to stop a rapid passing attack which brought the ball under the basket numerous times where it was caught by Captain Milton Thomson forward. Cox and Adams were the high point men of the one-sided game. Cox completed six field goals and one free throw to total 13 units and the division of the Southeastern Athletic association of which Baldwin high school is a member, into two sections.

Score In Second
Williams failed on a free throw as the second quarter opened and Cooney immediately scored a point on a foul which given two chances. Thomson failing from the foul line started a series of misses for both teams which was ended by himself when he got in close to the backboard and angled the ball into the cage. Following numerous Birmingham shots which were wide, Williams smashed and dribbled to the basket to drop the ball in the hoop. After failures by players of either side on foul shots Thomson completed scoring in the first half by looping a short throw to the cage. The score board registered Home—14, Opponents—4.

Patten who entered the game for Spencer of Rochester tossed a point after being fouled by Doherty. Cox offset this by dropping in the ball from under the basket. Cox, Patten and J. Schwarze failed on tosses from the foul stripe before Parker edged into the basket and scored. Cox tried a long shot after this which failed, but following in he took the rebound and scored from under the backboard. Cox passing brought Cooney into position near the hoop and he registered on an attempt. Patten heaved a long shot soon after which went true and following failures on foul shots by the home team and visitors Cooney tossed the ball in the cage from the foul line and Patten repeated the operation as the quarter ended Birmingham leading, 21-10.

Cox started a long string of scoring in the fourth quarter by angling the ball into the hoop and making good on a free throw awarded him after a foul. Immediately following this episode Thomson looped the hoop on a short shot. After a time-out by Rochester, Cox sank the ball from close to the board after rapid passing put him in position. Thomson in the same manner added another marker. H. Schwarze after failing on an attempt from behind the foul line. Thomson soon rung up another goal and added one point on a free throw to end the villagers' run of scoring. Among several failures

on each side Patten dropped the ball through the cage twice after a foul was committed against him. H. Schwarze failed on a toss from the foul line as the final gun sounded. The scorebooks showed, Birmingham-35, Rochester-12.


