Notice is further given that there will be submitted at said election the question of incorporation of the Village of Birmingham, without change in boundaries, as a City.

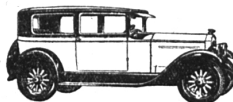

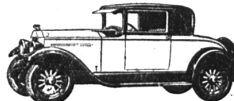
