REVISE LISTS IN BALDWIN LIBRARY

Miss Olga Down, New Librarian, To Revamp Entire System

Every volume in the school library is to be recatalogued and classified according to Miss Olga Down, new librarian at Baldwin High School.

Miss Down says that the reference books that make up the large part of the 5,700 volumes in the library are largely old or obsolete. New editions may be ordered after the present cataloging is finished and many new books of fiction have already been ordered.

"The purpose of a school library is to instill in the minds of the students a love of good literature," says Miss Down. She is ordering books of the more classical type and those on the standard reading lists.

The library is to be re-equipped in several respects with new shelves, pictures and other fixtures.

The Dewey decimal system is used in the library for arranging

the books. For the convenience of the students a shelf list arranged according to class is being prepared. The books will also be listed alphabetically. Students may take out fiction books only before and after school, and at noon.

Miss Down has catalogued the high school library at Ferndale. She found several books, she said, in the Baldwin library written in foreign languages, such as French, Latin and Greek.
