Costume Jewelry Now Goes Into the Sea

Necklaces, bracelets and anklets are being worn with the bathing costume. They are destined of wood and guaranteed to be 100 per cent sun and water proof. You will find an illustration of a favorite design for bathing jewelry at the upper right of the sketch. It shows a painted wood necklace with anklets to match. At the lower left you will find another design, consisting of a long chain and four bracelets, fashioned from small Chinese red disks. This jewelry is also worn with the beach frock. Slightly simply forgets to take it off when she goes into the water. But it's the vogue to forget.

Appropriate Fashions

Fashion never loses sight of the appropriate. When we adopt this or that dictate, we sometimes mistake the lady's intention, as, for instance, when we wear satin shoes for street wear, when Dame Fashion designs them for evening only. So while our mother of the wardrobe ordains wood jewelry for bathing and beach wear, with the same degree of the appropriate, she designs leather for sports wear. This jewelry is generally fashioned from kidskin to get the right coloring, and as another new note in the ensemble, adding necklaces and bracelet to the kid shoes and hand bag. The light-weight sports fabrics, you know, actually demand lightweight shoes.

Leather Jewelry Pictured

In the illustration at the lower right of the sketch you will find an example of this leather jewelry. In this we find the same type kid choker and bracelet we have seen before, but with this difference centering in the more feminine trend. There are three tri-colored composition flowers dangling from neck and wrist, just to prove that even leather may adopt the very feminine note. The center of each flower is a pearl, not necessarily of great price, but a pearl nevertheless.

For the more conservative, who would still adhere to the latest mode, there is the gold and silver and jade sports jewelry. In the illustration at the upper left, is shown a charming example of gold sports jewelry, in a flexible modernistic necklace and broad band flexible bracelet. Very long earrings of oddly-shaped segments, with choker to match, in gold or silver, are also worn with the sports ensemble.

Rose for Sports



Shades of rose make this colorful sports suit for southern wear. The jacket is deep rose flannel, worn over a frock of pale pink jersey banded in the same shade as the coat. The scarf blends the two colors.

Today's Recipes

Chicken à la King—Two cups chicken diced, four tablespoons butter, four tablespoons flour, one teaspoon salt, two cups milk, two tablespoons chopped pimientos, one-half cup canned mushrooms, six slices butter toast or patty shells. Melt butter, add green pepper and cook until pepper is soft, then add flour mixed with salt. Stir until blended, add milk. Stir until smooth. Add chicken, pimientos and mushrooms cut in pieces. Serve on toast, or in patty shells and garnish with parsley. A can of tuna fish or any other cooked and flaked fish may be used in place of the chicken. Stir until smooth.

Lemon Cream Sponge Pie—Two tablespoons butter, one cup sugar, three tablespoons lemon juice, one cup sweet milk, six level tablespoons flour, three eggs, rind of one-half lemon. Cream butter and light sugar. Add egg yolks lightly beaten. Add grated rind and the lemon juice. Take remaining half of sugar, mix well in the flour, add milk and stir well. After mixture is well blended stir in the stiffly beaten egg whites; stir in well.

Suggestions

Cranberry Conserve
Has your stock of preserves given out after the onrush of the holiday? A little work with seasonable material fills up the jam jar again. Here is a recipe for cranberry conserve which will help: One quart cranberries, four cups sugar, one-half cup water, one-half cup raisins, one orange (thinner sliced), one-half cup blanched almonds. Cook cranberries with water in covered kettle until berries burst. Mash the pulp through a fruit press or sieve; add two cups sugar and boil until sugar dissolves. To the pulp add raisins, orange and other two cups of sugar. Cook for about thirty minutes, or until conserve consistency, then add blanched, shredded almonds. Boil five minutes. Pour into hot, clean jars and seal.

Don't Spoil Them

If you should find that you have not enough fat to fry the croquettes, don't spoil them by trying in insufficient fat, but put the croquettes in a greased pan and bake in a hot oven.
