## SPINACH CAKES—ONION SAUCE

Chop one and one-quarter cups cooked or canned spinach very fine with one hard-boiled egg. Add one teaspoon salt, one-eighth teaspoon pepper and one well-beaten egg. Let stand 15 minutes to stiffen; then form into flat cakes and dip into fine crumbs. Pan-fry in two table-spoons hot fat until brown on both sides. Add one grated onion to one cup of this white sauce. Pour over the spinach cakes.
