Accommodations For 248 Prisoners Now Provided In County

visors, according to Sheriff Frank Schram. Accommodations for 128 more prisoners, bringing the total in the jail to 248 is made possible by the additions. The new blocks were built this fall after an appropriation had been made by the board of supervisors. When the jail was first built these two floors were left unfinished because of a shortage of funds. On each floor are eight sleeping cells which bunk eight prisoners each. During the day the prisoners are all to be locked in the large dining rooms on each floor. In these rooms are iron benches and approval was given by the building committee of the board of super-

day unless they are ill. Turnkeys at the jail will never be required to enter the cell blocks as openings are provided where food may be passed through. Shower baths are located off each large dining room. The cell block on the second floor will be used as a receiving room for drunken prisoners and others who will be kept separate from sober prisoners. The new cells are provided where food may be passed through the windows. In the new cells the prisoners are not able to reach the windows while in the old ones the cells are not separated from the windows.

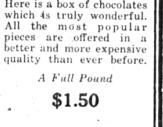
