### COUNTY CHAPTER OF RED CROSS REPORTS 1927 BIGGEST YEAR

The biggest year in the history of the Oakland County Chapter of the American Red Cross was 1927, according to a review this week by Carrie M. Taylor, secretary.

Miss Taylor served at the school dynamiting disaster at Bath, Mich., last spring, and since that time has been kept busy supervising the county chapter's share in the work of relief in numerous disasters throughout the country. A total of \$16,131.76 was subscribed to the Oakland County chapter for the National Red Cross fund for relief of Mississippi flood sufferers and a great deal of clothing for these citizens through the Red Cross here.

Aids Ex-Service Men A large part of the Oakland County chapter's work during 1927 was in assisting former service men in filing applications for adjusted service compensation, or federal bonus, Miss Taylor points out. The time limit for filing expired last Saturday.

The chapter's headquarters are located in the Welfare Building, where Miss Taylor and one assistant take care of all the work. The executive committee, of Pontiac, and the board of directors, representing every township in the county, supervise the work of the chapter.
