Is He a Self-Starter?

Right

When one is able to start by himself it must be said that he is original. He does not need others to think for him. Initiative, then, is the first quality we must look for in the handwriting. Let us see: Anything unlike cursive formation will indicate initiative ability or the originality to go ahead without copying some form or plan of procedure. Unusual capitals or small letter formations indicate the self-starting type. If he had to wait to be told, he would write as others of the "Let-George-do-it" lodge write.

Painted furniture is becoming an almost universal possession. But painted furniture with distinguishing stencil is the last word in decoration. The stencils of our own designing must be clearly drawn. Then they are cut to order. Many artists are searching the libraries for ideas of old work on which to adapt patterns to modern uses.

For bathroom hampers and fish, seascapes are found, with fish that lend themselves to good coloring that can be seen through the greens and blues of the water. The background is frequently painted in by the home artist and the fish are stenciled where most needed to enhance the decorative effect. The alicath curtains are often stenciled to match.

The fruit and flower baskets that receive due attention from the designers and recently a breakfast nook set was painted a glossy black and then stenciled with single motifs of baskets of gaily colored fruits arranged border fashion. The fruits were stenciled in white, the baskets were yellow and the fruits were touched up in natural colors by the home artist.

Another set was done with a set painted the same glossy black and the stencil was done in gold. The design was a garland of leaves forming a border. This same border would be effective on old blue, golden brown and hunter green. Gold is not good with the lighter colors for background.

Summer draperies of cracker natural colored linens are lovely stenciled in original designs. If they are well done and the color carefully selected, the materials wash most satisfactorily.

The stencils are done with lukewarm water and white soap. Do not write so hard as to crack the paper. Rub in the soap and press damp. Rub borders with arabesque decorative motifs are especially effective, the color corresponding with the decorations of wall paper or rug.

There is a great knack required to stencil and a good one must be well stretched and held firmly in place. Then a round brush with a pure white that used must be carefully wiped every few minutes as well as the design. Paint shops which cut the designs give all directions.

WOMAN RINGS HUGE CHURCH TOWER BELL
Ruth Coniston, formerly a Connecticut girl, has been given the permanent position of ringing 100,000 pounds of chimes in the Park Avenue Baptist Church tower of New York. The chimes, which are the gift of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., are the largest in the world. Heretofore they have been played only by a man because of the strenuous required to bring out the proper tones. Miss Coniston, one of the few woman carillon players in the world, says the American Magazine in telling of her unique work.

Some ideas of the work required to bring music from the bells with sufficient volume to drown the harsh noises of the city on special holidays is shown by the fact that the great bass G, largest of the bells in the tower, weighs 20,000 pounds. Fifty-two others range downward to the little treble bell, which weighs but nine pounds. They are connected by wires and mechanical devices to a keyboard which looks like a row of wooden clogs. Miss Coniston often has to use every ounce of her strength to make the larger bells respond. She wears gloves with finger protectors and strikes the keys with the outside of her fists, but in spite of this precaution, her hands are often badly bruised and blistered after a long program such as that of the week preceding Christmas.

MENU HINTS

The winter months are best for sea foods of this kind and it is a good plan to try including them at least once a week in the family bill of fare.

Try these recipes for seafood cookery.

Crab Meat Chops
Two lobsters boiled, one teaspoon chopped parsley, one-half teaspoon grated onion, one cup thick white sauce.

Tartar Sauce
One cup mayonnaise dressing, one tablespoon chopped capers, one tablespoon cucumber, one tablespoon tarragon vinegar, pickles.

Crab Meat Chops
Two cups crab meat, boiled and peeled, one teaspoon chopped parsley, one-half teaspoon chopped onion, one cup thick white sauce, one-half teaspoon salt, cayenne pepper.

Hollandaise Sauce
Make thick white sauce, mix with the rest of the ingredients. Cook all together and cool. Make eight separate heaps of this and let stand an hour. Take each heap and form into a chop shape, dip in beaten egg, dredge in cracker dust and fry in hot deep fat. Serve with hot Hollandaise sauce.

One-half cup butter, a few grains cayenne pepper, two eggs (yolks), one-fourth teaspoon salt, one tablespoon lemon juice, one-half cup boiling water.

With a wooden or silver spoon rub the butter to a cream, add the yolks one at a time. Beat well, add the lemon juice, salt and pepper. About five minutes before serving add the boiling water and stir rapidly. Cook over water or in double boiler until it thickens.

Coffee Cake
Take one and one-half cups flour, one-fourth teaspoon baking powder, six teaspoons sugar, two tablespoons shortening, one egg, one-half teaspoon salt, two tablespoons chopped nut meats, one-fourth cup raisins, two tablespoons candied lemon and orange peel.

Sift dry ingredients. Add liquid fat with unbeaten egg, milk, chopped nuts and fruits; stir to a smooth dough. Spread in shallow pan and cover with top mixture.
