refinement about her which a camera cannot reproduce.

Helping Industry.
Mr. Ellerbe declared that Brooks is playing a great part in the development of the aircraft industry. The trip to Mexico which is said to be the longest passenger trip on record, is a milestone in the progress of aviation, he said.

The airplane is seen as one of the greatest factors in a universal brotherhood by Mr. Stout. Through this medium peace is closer for all nations than it ever has been, he declared.

The airplane will enable nations to be closer together and will make for a more complete understanding. It is the greatest industry in the history of man, he declared. "In substantiation of this, he pointed out that while travel on the earth and water has its natural limitations, there are no limitations for travel in the air.

"The new industry will revolutionize the world," he said. "It will afford more peace for men and it will affect every city in the world. Soon it will have eclipsed the auto industry."

The idea for the flight to Mexico came from the reading in a newspaper that Mr. Lindbergh had been invited to Mexican officials to spend Christmas Day with her son in that country, he said.

Because of her duties as teacher of mathematics in the Cass-Technical High School in Detroit, the time Mrs. Lindbergh

had for travel was limited. Soon it was arranged to attempt the flight by plane.

A Monotonous Trip.
"More monotonous than riding on a street car," was the manner in which Mr. Stout described the trip to Mexico. Ovariations were accorded the travelers at every stop and flowers became so numerous that they had to be thrown from the plane to the startled farmers in the west who ran from their houses to see the plane pass, he said.

Mexico accorded the travelers a hearty welcome and the friendly spirit prevailed throughout the stay, he said. While in Mexico City, Mr. Brooks took up practically all the leading officials of the country.

The clouds and the mountains and the gulf of Mexico made the trip seem like a voyage through Fairyland, he said.

However, on the return, Brooks had opportunity to glare at the trip from the sky. He showed his skill in handling a plane. At one time the party flew over Chicago, about 100 feet above the downtown buildings, in a heavy snow storm seeking a place to

land. Fuel was low and the storm was increasing in terror. All members of the party were tired from the travel of many miles. Suddenly the plane served. A landing was soon made in the first available place, a race track.

Next morning the weather looked favorable for a take off. However what should have been a two and one half hour trip to Detroit from Chicago lasted more than 24 hours.

The plane was forced to land in a cornfield at Edwadsburg, Mich., a town which was thoroughly snow bound.

This was another incident of how history was made when Lindbergh piloted the Spirit of St. Louis across the Atlantic. His feat was made by the flight to Mexico City. History is being made by all brave men who seek to conquer the air.
