COACH PLANT MOVE SEEN

Arrangements Made To Accommodate Children Of Workers

Plans are being made in Pontiac and Bloomfield Township to accommodate families of the workers in the new plant of the Yellow Truck & Coach Manufacturing company...

The letter is relative to the school facilities here and the eligibility of children who would be transferring from the Chicago schools to those of Pontiac. 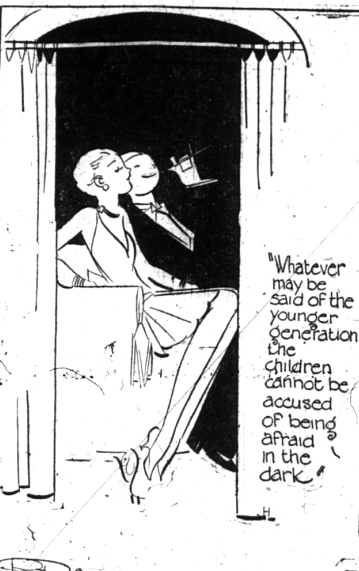

HOW to Achieve Beauty

The Best Way to Shampoo Many women are afraid to shampoo their hair as often as they should because they think it breaks it and causes it to fall out. Consequently they go around the greater part of the time with the natural beauty of their hair clouded by excessive oiliness or dust and dirt.

The truth is, that if your hair is shampooed in the right way, and given the proper care in between washings, it is perfectly safe to keep it clean enough to show off all its beauty every bit of the time. Normal hair can be washed once every ten days, dry hair every two weeks, and oily hair as often as twice a week.

The best effects, both in securing immaculate cleanliness and in bringing out all the lustre, softness and natural curl in your hair, are obtained by using a shampoo that has strong herbal content. Such a shampoo is tonic as well as cleansing, and because of the absence of heavy oils, it rinses out easily. It is surprising how many women do not get all the soap out of their hair when they shampoo it themselves, even with two or three rinsings. Soap left in the hair makes it stiff and unmanageable, and seriously detracts from the beauty of its coloring.

Hot oil shampoos are excellent for everyone's hair and scalp, and they are really surprisingly easy to give yourself at home. Heat two or three tablespoonfuls of oil. There are balsam oils which are especially good, as they are nourishing and at the same time contain vegetable ingredients that keep the scalp stimulated to normal activity. Apply the oil as hot as you can bear it, a half hour before washing. If your hair is split at the ends, work the oil well into them. Wrap hot towels around your head to drive the oil in. Charles Bingham Views Prospects For Year With Optimism

The outlook for Birmingham real estate for 1928 is at least as promising as it was for 1927, says Charles A. Bingham, newly elected president of the real estate board. "With an almost certain prospect of a new postoffice for Birmingham, the Kresge lease on the property of S. O. Wiley Bell and the F. J. Mulholland company and great strides in the developments of the public service companies, we have made a good beginning already," he said.

According to Mr. Bingham, the biggest development in real estate in Birmingham this year will be in the residence districts and in the downtown business area. Factories, he feels sure, will never come to Birmingham. "We are ideally situated for homes and as long as the property is as restricted as it is, no project for factories will ever be introduced into Birmingham that would be met with approval by the people of the city," says Mr. Bingham's opinion.

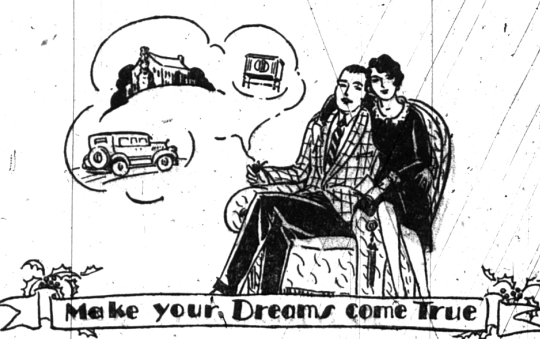
