# ACCIDENT IS UNAVOIDABLE, COURT RULES

William Fields, of Pontiac, charged, with involuntary manslaughter in connection with the death June 11 of Patrolman Robert Dexter of Bloomfield Hills Village, is free today following an examination in Justice Court, Pontiac.

The case against Fields was dismissed by Judge Henry W. Harper for "lack of evidence."

Fields admitted driving his machine on the wrong side of Woodward avenue when the car he was driving crashed into it. Dexter died a short time after the accident.

# CHANGE DATE ON HEARING

Bloomfield Township Roads Up August 4

Date for the hearings on the paving of Bloomfield Township roads is set today at Aug. 4, according to James V. Bayley, township clerk, and not July 28 as previously announced in the township office.

Eleven roads are proposed to be improved at a cost approximating \$88,000. The hearings will be at 8 p. m. in the Bloomfield Township offices in Birmingham.

The roads to be paved are: Glenary from Maple to Glenary circle; Clifton from Maple to Morningview Terrace and north Clifton road from Clifton to Morningview Terrace; Overhill from Morningview Terrace to Broadway boulevard; Chestnut Cross from Hamilton to north Clifton; and from Maple to Chestnut Cross; Drury Lane from Morningview Terrace; Williamsburg from Cranbrook to Glenary circle; Pine street from the Cranbrook road to the east line of the Bloomfield Village; Tilbury road from Waddington road to Cranbrook road and Tilbury place from Broadway boulevard to Tilbury road; Waddington road from Tilbury road to Yarmouth road; Yarmouth road from Tilbury place to the east line of Bloomfield Village; and Tottenham road from Quairton road to the east line of Bloomfield Village.

# VILLAGER JAILED ON ASSAULT COUNT

Fancher Faces Charge Of Resisting Officer Who Arrested Him

Charles Fancher, of Holland avenue, is in the Oakland County jail today awaiting the hearing of an appeal after being found guilty of assault and battery in Justice Malcolm Hunt's court Monday and sentenced to 30 days.

The complaint was made by Kenneth Northrup, an employee of the Birmingham Transfer company, who said Fancher hit him on the head with a blackjack. At the completion of this sentence Fancher will face another charge of resisting an officer.

When Patrolman George Townsend went to replevin a gin pole, which is used by the Birmingham Transfer company in moving pianos, Fancher resisted him, police say.

Northrup and Moore were said to have gone to Fancher's home last Saturday for the pole. Fancher refused to give it to them and a fight followed in which Fancher and Moore participated. Fancher snatched a blackjack from Northrup's pocket and struck him on the head with it, according to testimony.

# JUDGE DOTY HURT IN CRASH

Circuit Judge Frank L. Doty is recovering today from injuries received Tuesday when the car he was driving crashed into a safety zone at South Saginaw street and Eastlawn court, Pontiac. Mrs. Laura Doty, his mother, riding with him escaped unhurt.

Taken to the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital it was found he had received a broken arm and severe cuts and bruises. He is expected to be removed to his home today, however.

Witnesses of the accident said another car crowded him into the safety zone which was unlighted. Judge Doty is a former Birmingham village attorney.

# CHILD STEERS, DAD ARRESTED

Drunk, Father Turns Wheel Over To Six-Year-Old Son

Realizing that he was too drunk to drive his car, Leonard Stanton of Orion, placed his six-year-old son on his lap and had him steer as they passed through Birmingham Sunday. It was testified in Justice Malcolm Hunt's court Monday when Stanton was tried for drunken driving. He was fined \$15.

The man was arrested by Patrolman Joseph McGregor when the car ran the red light at Woodward and Oakland avenues.

Elmer Williams, also of Orion, arrested with him, paid a fine of \$15 on a drunk charge.
